

Restrictions here may have eased, but many people affected by leprosy still face the fear, stigma and disabling effects of disease.

Children and families living in poverty often have compromised immune systems and underlying health issues like malnutrition... which makes them even more susceptible

to diseases like leprosy and coronavirus.

The pandemic has highlighted the importance of early detection and prompt treatment for disabling diseases like leprosy. And while you and I have been self-isolating at home, leprosy-affected people know what it's is like to experience ongoing isolation and stigma... sometimes for years. Now coronavirus has only intensified their sense of isolation, stigma and fear.

The pandemic has also placed an extra burden on our field workers. They have to treat and care for people with leprosy while navigating the real and present danger of coronavirus. In these pages, you'll find an update of how coronavirus has impacted the ministry in India and Nepal – and what your gifts are doing to help.

COVID-19 Relief & Response



You're helping to provide COVID-19 relief in India... thank you.

Your support is changing lives during this time of coronavirus. Your compassion and commitment to people affected by leprosy and disability is truly inspiring!

Underpinning this is your love and compassion. Modelled by Jesus and carried on today by The Leprosy Mission staff in India.

We have all heard the word "unprecedented" used an awful lot recently. The spread of this new virus is causing unprecedented difficulties in getting help to people affected by leprosy too.

Leprosy patients are struggling to get to hospital to access the treatment that they urgently need.

Health care in India is now focused on treating coronavirus. And this is putting an enormous strain on The Leprosy Mission Hospital's resources.

But your compassion and commitment

to people affected by leprosy is ensuring they receive the cure and care they need during this pandemic.

Our team on the field in India are committed to protecting those most at risk of coronavirus – those affected by leprosy and disability. They call it Virus Pe Vijay – or Victory Over Virus. And your caring heart and prayer are a blessing now more than ever.

A nationwide lockdown left many without work or income. This is tough even when you have no health issues... but it's even harder for those living with leprosy. Many don't have access to the good health care system, nutritious food and the technology we take for granted. And many already have compromised immune systems.

How coronavirus is impacting ongoing leprosy ministry

While dealing with coronavirus must be the first priority, field staff are working hard to ensure the core leprosy ministry continues... with your help!

- Hospitals are still accepting patients subject to social distancing rules.
 But self-help groups and outreach clinics to spot the first signs of leprosy have stopped since meeting in groups is no longer allowed.
- Multi-Drug Therapy remains available. It's vital to ensure those undergoing treatment do not stop taking this medication. Doctors are issuing extra doses so people don't have to visit as often to get their medication or in case clinics close.
- Staff are preparing to treat Coronavirus patients as well as educating people about the most effective ways to stop the spread of the illness.

Your Christian heart for God's healing ministry toward people affected by leprosy means they are not forgotten during this time. Thank you. You are amazing!



Our team in India have been providing coronavirus relief packages for those who have lost income including:

- Grocery kits containing dry rations, vegetables and daily essentials.
- Hygiene kits including masks, gloves, sanitisers and soaps.

They're rolling out protective measures against coronavirus including:

- Hospital visitors checked for fever to keep other patients safe.
- Making face masks and supplying them to leprosy-affected people.
- Education about hand hygiene, face masks and social distancing to stop the spread of the illness.
- Posters, banners, brochures and videos produced in multiple languages for display in hospitals, public places and social media.



You've helped provide transparent face masks for the hearing-impaired during coronavirus


What if you're required to wear a face mask to stop coronavirus... but you're hearing-impaired and rely on lipreading to communicate?

Traditional face masks make it impossible to read lips, which is crucial for the hearing impaired to understand conversation. And even if you use sign language, you still need to lipread and see facial expressions to fill in the gaps in phrases, questions, responses and other linking terms.

After identifying this problem with hearing-impaired patients, The Leprosy Mission Trust India has produced a solution - masks with transparent mouth covers.

The see-through layer makes it easy for the hearing-impaired to read lips, while still preventing the spread of coronavirus.

Nepal Coronavirus Update



Anandaban Hospital transforms into Coronavirus centre

Thank you for not forgetting people affected by leprosy during the pandemic. Without your support, they may not experience God's love through the care they receive.

Your amazing Christian heart is essential to God's healing ministry toward people affected by leprosy. God bless you for so faithfully supporting leprosy patients at Anandaban Hospital in Nepal. With the global pandemic, this long-running hospital has become a focal point not only for leprosy treatment but also for treating coronavirus.

In fact, The Leprosy Mission Nepal

has asked the government to designate Anandaban as an official centre for coronavirus management. Your gifts and prayers at this time have been vital to continue the important work of helping people affected by leprosy through the self-care unit during the outbreak.

To date, the hospital has taken the following actions to deal with coronavirus:


- Setting up an isolation ward within the emergency room and providing personal protective equipment (PPE) to protect hospital staff on the frontlines of treating coronavirus in Nepal.
- Running a fever clinic with Rapid Diagnostic Testing (RDT) and Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) testing both available to detect and confirm coronavirus cases as fast as possible.
- Ongoing stocks of sanitiser, masks and disinfecting soap needed to distribute to patients and people affected by leprosy living on the grounds of the hospital.

The pandemic has highlighted many of the issues common to both leprosy and coronavirus. Overcrowded, unsanitary conditions lead to higher risk of contracting both conditions. And both also require early diagnosis and treatment.

The hospital staff at Anandaban know that your heart is with them as they go that extra mile in faith. As they're ministering to people and showing that God loves them.

Even in the midst of the pandemic, God is there working in people's lives... with your help! Thank you!

At just 16 years old, she's excited to be supporting the vision of No Child with Leprosy by 2035. Like you, she wants to help other children with early detection and treatment of leprosy to stop permanent disability.





You're continuing the fight against the stigma of leprosy!

When Sarawati's own father died from leprosyrelated complications, her grandfather declared it was a curse and a judgment.



So it's no wonder this young girl kept her own leprosy a secret from her family. She covers her face when talking about it.

"I don't like to think what people would say if they knew. It is very scary for me."

Saraswati was just a child when she first developed leprosy but it took 6 years to get an official diagnosis. By then, the patches on her leg were so bad she could barely walk.

Forced to drop out of school, terrified people would reject her, trying to keep her leprosy a secret – Sarawati felt so alone. And just like those with coronavirus, she self-isolated. Not for two weeks or a month. **But for years...**

But when she arrived at Anandaban Hospital, she immediately felt welcomed and loved. Finally, she had found a place where she could be accepted and receive the medical treatment she urgently needed.... thanks to supporters like you!

Although outreach clinics to find cases of leprosy can't continue during the pandemic, we need to be ready to deploy them again as soon as restrictions are lifted. To diagnose and treat more young people like Sarawati. And to prevent ulcers and disabilities – and even amputations.

Even during the pandemic, your amazing commitment to people like Sarawati means that they are getting the medication they need. You're ensuring that staff can continue to take care of patients at the hospital.

Now Sarawati doesn't need to live in fear of rejection! Thank you for helping to fight the stigma of leprosy.

Coronavirus crisis relief distributed to 400 leprosy-affected households... because of your compassionate heart!

Rice, cooking oil, vegetables and dry goods... this crisis relief will help leprosy-affected families in Nepal who have lost livelihoods due to lockdown restrictions.

Families also received health packages with sanitiser, face masks, soap and COVID-19 information leaflets.

Amar Timalsina, a board member of The Leprosy Mission Nepal and president of leprosy organisation IDEA Nepal, is **so grateful to you** for




making it possible to reach so many families with crisis relief.

1847 Foundation

The ministry you support begins with Wellesley and Alice Bailey (above) in the UK. They start The Mission to Lepers after witnessing the devastating effects of leprosy on people in India. Their childhood friends, the Pim sisters (Charlotte Pim right), pledge to raise £30 a year to help these people.



1888 First Hospital

The Mission's first hospital opens in Purulia, West Bengal. It's still one of The Leprosy Mission's flagship medical centres supporters like you help to this day.



1913

Australian Office Opens

The Leprosy Mission opens its doors in Australia, thanks to supporters who had the same heart as you all those years ago. The work spreads to China, Japan, New Zealand, the Philippines, Korea, Malaysia, Singapore and across Africa.

1940s

First Leprosy Cure

Dapsone becomes the first effective cure for the less virulent form of leprosy, revolutionising the work. It's kind Australians like you who supported this treatment and helped cure of millions of patients.



1950s

Pioneering Surgery

Pioneering surgeon Dr Paul Brand (above) develops life-changing reconstructive surgery techniques. Thanks to your support, his techniques are still used today to restore mobility to the hands and feet of people affected by leprosy.

1960s

Further Expansion

The Leprosy Mission Australia starts supporting projects in Papua New Guinea, Thailand and Nepal, where the new Anandaban Hospital is opened.

1970s

Australian Pioneer

Sydney surgeon and missionary Dr Grace Warren AM worked with people affected by leprosy in Hong Kong, Korea and India over many decades. She learned surgical techniques from Dr Paul Brand and pione self-care treatments for ulcerated feet. Of the many honours she received for her work, her favourite was the Star of Pakistan awarded in 1972 by a Muslim country to



1980s

Breakthrough Leprosy Cure

The new Multi-Drug Therapy (MDT) cures people with leprosy in as little as six months. The generosity of Australian supporters like you helps to roll out MDT programs with millions treated. With so many successful cures, attention turns to self-care and selfhelp programs for people left with disabilities due to leprosy.



1990s

Princess Patron

As official patron for The Leprosy Mission, Princess Diana had a true passion for the work. It was one of the few charities. she retained in 1996 when she reduced her patronage of almost 100 charities down to just six. She made headlines when she touched people affected by leprosy - against the advice of royal officials.

2000s A World Without Leprosy?

The number of leprosy cases is at its lowest ever point - thank you for being part of this great achievement. The concept of a world without leprosy starts to look real and is adopted as a global vision in 2005.

Hidden Leprosy Cases

New leprosy case numbers are down to 250,000 or less per year, from a peak of over 1 million. But the stigma of leprosy lingers. Concern remains over the many hidden cases of leprosy and those at risk or left with disabilities. We're still finding these cases with your ongoing generosity!


